The Early Childhood Education schedule

Focus areas

- Birthing in Our Community Early Learning Program – six weeks to three years
- Deadly Kindies Intensive – three to five years
- Deadly Kindies – three to five years

Activities

- Promotion of Kindy, Playgroups, Community Events, Online early learning resources, Kindy Tours, Enrolment support, Referrals into UIH System of Care, External Referral pathways




Deadly Kindies Intensive

- Working one on one with families to empower them, giving their bubs and jarjum the best start to life

Types of Support

- Finding a local culturally safe early learning centre (kindy and long day care)
- Birth certificates, enrolment forms, childcare subsidy advice
- Linking to UIH System of Care – Clinics for immunisations and Health Checks, Paediatric Allied Health, Dental and Disability Services
- Partnering with external agencies to best support families
- Home visits
- Playgroups
